

Career Objective: Make a large impact in the **improvement of global welfare**. Do this through positive globalization – increasing trade and direct investment while maintaining and safeguarding stability. This will include 1) strengthening, reforming, and growing the international systems of trade, 2) fixing, refining, and expanding the theory, methodology, and implementation of modernization and globalization of economies. Ensure that all aspects are taken into account including 1) the environment, 2) income distribution and equality, 3) Cultural and ethnic uniqueness

Academic Objectives:

- Study and understand how the **international economic system** works - how international trade and investment works.
- Study and understand how economies modernize, liberalize, and open up. (What did the 4 Asian Tigers do right?). How does **Economic Development** work – what is the theory, methodology, and implementation?
- Understand the **political challenges to the effective modernization** of economies.
- Understand the **criticisms and objections to globalization**. Understand how the field of economic development can learn from this, what it can incorporate to its methodology, and how it can effectively answer to and address these concerns.

Career Objective: Ensure the peaceful economic, social and political **development of China** in specifically, and the Asia-Pacific region in general. Do this by promoting understanding and co-operation between China and other nations (especially the US), promoting engagement rather than containment policies for other nations towards China (especially the US), ensuring the continued path of development of China (reform of banking system, SOEs, etc), ensuring a peaceful evolution of the political and social system of China.

Academic Objectives:

- Understand **China's modern economic development**. Understand the theory and methodology to their modernization, What challenges lie ahead, and develop a POV for what is necessary policy for continued successful modernization.
- Understand **China's domestic and foreign politics**. Understand what are key elements of the system and how they contribute to stability, peace, and development. Identify what elements risk stability, peace, and development.
- Study and understand the **politics of Asia**. What are the dynamics of the relationships and the balances of power? What are the trends and what are the future challenges?

Career Objective: Make a large impact in **world peace and stability** through the strengthening of multilateral co-operation. Do this through fixing and reforming existing multi-national institutions (i.e. the UN), promoting the transfer of sovereignty from the state level to the multi-national level, promoting the creation, growth, and legitimacy of institutions such as the International Criminal Court.

Academic Objectives:

- Understand the **International system** (UN, WB, IMF, WTO), and the foundational theories of IR

- Understand **core theory and issues** of the academic study and practical application of **international affairs**. Be able to understand and contribute to debates in this space.
- Develop robust **quantitative skills**. (i.e. statistics & econometrics)
